Re: MIJS Parent Survey Feedback







Parental General Comments

Just want to say a massive thank you from us. XXX had a horrible start to school (XXX in XXX) and we were very apprehensive about starting a new school. MIS has exceeded our expectations, XXX and XXX in XXX have been so supportive of XXX joining, and always supporting XXX in reading. XXX runs to school in the morning, is greeted by peers and staff, and has no anxiety going into school like XXX used to at reception. We're so pleased we chose MIS. Thank you to all the teachers and XXX staff who helped ease our anxieties and settled us in so quick!

XXX loves school. We feel that the school has a child-centred approach and that staff work hard to create an environment where students establish a love of learning and school in general. We feel that XXX is genuinely cared for and looked after at school. We are very happy with Mundesley.

Office staff - go above and beyond and are very helpful!

Excellent class teacher, reading much more often at school, teacher very responsive. Excellent photographic transition pack given.

I feel we don't get much information on what the children are doing or learning, especially younger years. Tapestry is available but no teachers ever post anything on there, DOJO is another amazing app which the school doesn't use which is great for children sharing work, speaking to teachers and having daily updates on what children are learning doing and friends they're making. This is definitely lacking as most days my younger child can't even remember what XXX did 5 minutes ago let alone in the morning.

XXX would have liked to have gone on the school council and gone over to the infants to help. XXX brought a letter home about it and XXX was so enthusiastic about it but didn't get chosen. XXX said it's always the same

children who do which I agree with. I am not sure XXX gets the recognition XXX deserves and that upsets me a bit so just thought I would mention it. XXX seems happy enough so that's good.

The new new intake time of 8:40-8:50 is regularly not being implemented, often we're stood waiting beyond 8:45 which puts additional pressure on those wishing to talk to staff when they come out

I feel there is a big jump from juniors school to high school and the amount of homework children receive it is often overwhelming for them. If we build up now with maybe a maths set of homework, writing, reading etc they will be more accustomed to it in the transition.

I find coastal expensive for wrap around care- \pounds 2.00 for 20 mins of care in the morning compared to \pounds 2.50 for over an hour in the afternoon.

The introduction of a holiday club would be very useful for working parents. I believe the school should try have a member of staff outside gates to prevent cars parking on zig zags (they still do!) More effort for teachers to come out at 8:40am allowing parents to get to work on time.

Feedback

As we reviewed the survey responses, we observed a variety of opinions regarding specific aspects of school life, with a common theme standing out - the promptness of the school gates opening at 8:40am. We acknowledge the importance of this matter and will explore ways to address it effectively.

Another significant point that surfaced multiple times in the feedback was the need for improved communication. We are actively working on enhancing our communication channels. We want to highlight the various electronic communication methods we currently use. All school communications are issued electronically and designed to be phone-friendly, recognising that smartphones are the most commonly used devices. Our Weekly Update is posted on the website every Friday. Additionally, each school has a dedicated website (MJS: <u>here</u> and MIS: <u>here</u>) where you can find a comprehensive archive of current and past communications, as well as live information and any upcoming events.

In addition to our digital efforts, we have been thrilled to extend invitations to parents for various school events. The Harvest Festival, Morning Reading Sessions and Book Looks have provided wonderful opportunities for parents to engage with our school. Your participation in these events is greatly appreciated and we look forward to continuing to create more occasions for meaningful connections between parents, our pupils and the school.

Thank you for your constructive feedback and for being an integral part of our school community. We appreciate your ongoing support and collaboration in making our school a vibrant and enriching environment for all.
